Spring Clean Up—June 09th & 16th

The Mussey Township **Spring Clean Up will be held on Saturday, June 09th & 16th from 8AM to 1PM**, 1/4 mile East of Capac Rd. on M-21 (Previous location of Fan-Tastic Vent). **Mussey Township residents and Mussey Township Property owners only.** No commercial use of the clean up is allowed. No household batteries, paint or nails. Freon products will be accepted with a \$15 charge. No items shall be removed from the premises after it is dropped off. Metal must be separated and placed in separate bins. Midway Disposal of Brown City will be providing the bins. If you have any questions, please call the Township Hall at 395-4915. Burning Permits: A reminder to residents that a burning permit is required for all open fires. You can obtain a permit at **no charge** from the Mussey Township Office 395-4915, Mon, Tues or Thursday from 9am - 12pm & 1pm - 4pm. You may also obtain a burning permit on-line at www.musseyfire.com, or on a link from our website www.musseytownship.org.

Building Permits: A Building Permit packet containing the necessary permits required for building in Mussey Township may be obtained at the Mussey Township Office or on-line at www.musseytownship.org.

Capac Youth Sports Committee: Over the past year the organization has expanded the parking at the soccer fields and constructed a walking track around the soccer fields. The walking track is .6 miles in length and is available at any time to all who choose to walk, run or bike. This was paid with funds provided by the Mussey Township Park and Recreation account.

The organization's short term goals are: (1). Build two pavilions to serve as public picnic areas and shelters for children during soccer and baseball events. (2). Create a play area for young children. (3). Build a concession stand and bathroom facility.

The purpose of the organization is to support construction and expansion of an active recreational facility for residents of Western St. Clair County through the following activities: (1). Organizing events for the benefit of the facility, hiring of contracted services and other means to improve the recreational facility. (2). Raising funds to expand and improve the facility. (3). Seeking grant funding to expand and improve the facility. (4). Enhance the facility through specific strategic projects. The Organization is exclusively for charitable, recreational, and community service purposes and intends to remain a non-profit organization in perpetuity.

Roads and Ditches:

The Mussey Township board has signed an agreement with the St. Clair County Road Commission to apply 110 loads of 23A gravel to township roads. Each load will weigh approximately 52 tons at a cost of \$9.86 per ton delivered.

The Township board has also budgeted \$50,000 to spend on ditching projects this year. If a property owner has a road ditch that they would like cleaned and are willing to pay 20% of the cost, the board will make that ditch a top priority.

Chloride: The Township will be putting one coat of chloride on all Township roads after the gravel has been spread in mid June. If your road needs additional dust control, you may contact the Township Hall to purchase a house spot in front of your residence for \$210. A house spot is 500 feet in length and the full width of the road. The material used is 21% calcium chloride applied at 2000 gallons per mile. If you do not need a full 500 feet, you may want to consider sharing the cost with a neighbor.

From the Fire Department: Welcome aboard our new Fire Chief, Jeff Kegler and a special thank you to William Stoutenburg for his years of service as Chief. Just a reminder about the tornado siren. The tornado siren is a steady blast lasting 3 minutes. It is used only to indicate either a tornado that has been spotted or an incident involving a hazardous materials. If the tornado siren activates you should take cover inside and listen to the local radio station FM WSAQ 107.1 or WGRT 102.3, also TV stations 2, 4, or 7 for updates. **DO NOT GO OUTSIDE UNTIL YOU ARE GIVEN THE ALL CLEAR SIGNAL.**

WHAT NOT TO DO: *Do not go to your child's school. They have plans in place and will be handling the situation. Your arrival will only impede the process. *Do not repeatedly call 9-1-1, only call for emergency services if you have an emergency. *Do not seal off the whole house or office building; there will not be enough time to do so. *Do not leave your shelter until given the "all clear" by authorities or until the time expires for the weather warning. *Do not risk your life for your pets. If you can not get them into the shelter, go into the shelter without them.
